How a Lost Room Became a Buffet

Background

Back in 2008, the shop manager of Barter Books, David Champion, went scouting around the premises to find more badly needed office space. And he not only found it, he found a whole room – a room no-one in the shop even knew existed. (There were no windows and the access door wasn't on the bookshop side of the central platform.) As the shop founder, Mary Manley, would be among the first to benefit from this new office space (until then Mary, herself, had had to work from home), he immediately sought her out. This would be great news! On their way to the room, David warned Mary that the room was virtually derelict. And so it was. After turning the large old-fashioned key in the lock, David slid open the heavy door to reveal a room seemingly untouched by time since the last train left Alnwick Station almost half a century before. For a moment, Mary was speechless. All the more as this lost room revealed yet more surprises: first, attached to the far wall, a magnificent green fern miraculously alive after all these years thanks to water from a nearby leaking drain pipe and (the second surprise) light from a totally unexpected source – a large glass skylight. “Look”, said David, “our office!” “No”, said Mary, looking from the fern up towards the skylight, already conjuring up something she had wanted far longer than a desk, a chair, a lamp – “This is our Buffet”.

The Skylight Room

The Skylight Room is the original 'lost' room, the 'window' in the corner marking where the sliding door had been. The room had started out as the Station's boiler room, one whose use most of us had never even heard of. The large boiler it originally housed was used to fill metal foot warmers (available to passengers for rent) as the carriages, especially in winter, could be freezing. (While you're in this room, do have a look at the facsimile copy of the North Eastern Railway's tile map of 1903 showing their rail network – then the largest in the world.) The fern, to Mary's grief, was cut down during an over-zealous cleaning job.

The Red Room

The original Buffet was soon enlarged to include the room just beyond it, now known as The Red Room. This room was originally the 1st Class Gents' Waiting Room. Its original mantelpiece has vanished; the present one was salvaged from Ilderton Station. (While you're in this room, note the painting above the mantelpiece; it was painted by our mural artist, Alnwick-born Peter Dodd (an Oscar-nominated animator), and shows the arrival of the Prince and Princess of Wales in Alnwick Station in 1908 – red carpet and all! (The royal train, by the way, is now on view in the great National Railway Museum in York.)

The Green Room

The next room along, The Green Room, was originally the passageway between Platforms 1 and 2. (Note the beautiful Victorian hand-made glazed brick, which was also used in our Old Waiting Room – the latter intended for 3rd class passengers.)

The Blue Room

The Blue Room was the former 1st Class Ladies' Waiting Room. This room retains its original marble mantelpiece. The painting, again by Peter Dodd, is of the last top-hat stationmaster in Alnwick, John Patterson, with the station, itself, depicted on the upper left. The pitch pine seating in the booths is made up of pews salvaged from St George's Church in Greenock, Scotland. And while you're here, have a look at the black and white check Northumberland Tartan. This tartan – a cloth woven with the wool of black and white sheep – is acknowledged as the oldest tartan of them all, thought to date back as far as late Roman times, the 4th c A.D.
